#### **Adoption Statement**

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with Regulations 11 and 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 (as amended) and gives notice that East Cambridgeshire District Council adopted the Cambridgeshire Flood and Water Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) under the provisions of Section 23 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on 16 November 2016.

The SPD provides guidance for developers and applicants on managing flood risk and the water environment in and around new developments. The contents of the SPD expand upon the flood risk and water management policies contained within the adopted and emerging Local Plans.

The Flood and Water SPD has been prepared by Cambridgeshire County Council in partnership with South Cambridgeshire, Cambridge, East Cambridgeshire, Huntingdonshire and Fenland District/City Councils; the Environment Agency; Anglian Water; and the Internal Drainage Boards.

The adopted version of the Cambridgeshire Flood and Water SPD includes modifications made by the Cambridgeshire County Council (in conjunction with partners) in the light of representations and other minor changes which, taken together, do not materially affect the policies. All the modifications made since the publication of the draft version of the SPD (September 2015) are included in the Consultation Statement report which is available to view on the Council's website and at the locations listed below.

Any person with sufficient interest in the decision to adopt the SPD may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for judicial review of the decision. Any such application must be made promptly and in any event not later than 3 months after the date on which the SPD was adopted.
