SPLASH PAD FOR ELY

An exciting new project, spearheaded by local residents, with rapidly growing public support

What is a Splash Pad?

- A water playground
- ► Featuring interactive sprinklers, fountains, water jets and much more
- Typically zoned into 3 areas catering for toddlers, children and teens
- Cheaper and safer to run than a traditional paddling pool
- Works well alongside existing dry play equipment as a leisure destination



How will it benefit families?



- ► Free family leisure facility
- Appeals to a wide range of ages, including teens
- Fully accessible to users with a range of disabilities
- Encourages families to be physically active in the fresh air
- Promotes water confidence an important skill for life

How will it benefit our local community?

- Draws visitors into the city
- Provides a customer base for local businesses
- Creates a positive meeting point for young people
- Enhances the appeal of Ely as a place to live and work



What is the **environmental impact**?



- Very low environmental impact
- Consumes water only when activated by users, with limitation settings available
- ► Flow through system requires no chemicals
- Grey water can be collected for council use
- Low profile visual design blends well into any chosen location
- Decreases journeys made by local residents to Cambridge and Newmarket locations

What do we recommend for Ely?

- £200k for a 150m² Splash Pad
- Low maintenance flow-through system with grey water collection
- Less than £10k per annum running costs (potentially funded by a small refreshment kiosk or sponsorship by local businesses)
- Minimal site requirements:
 2lps mains water supply, foul drain, single phase electricity, relatively flat land



Suggested sites:

High Barns / St. John's Road / Cherry Hill / Jubilee Gardens / Paradise Centre / Former MoD Site

Is there evidence for success?



- Three successful Splash Pads in Cambridge, endorsed by Ian Ross, Community Sport & Recreation Manager at CCC
- Newly refurbished Splash Pad in Newmarket, launched in 2019 to positive public and press response
- Splash Pad in St. Neots recently approved by councillors
- Consultation with Ustigate, the largest waterplay specialists in the UK with over 100 installations completed.

How much **public support** is there?

- ► Facebook page *Splash Pad for Ely, Cambs* gained over 1500 followers in just 2 weeks
- Change.org petition Splash Pad Campaign for Ely, Cambs has been signed by 1,973 local residents to date
- ▶ A brief online survey of young people by Voluntary & Community Action East Cambs received 231 detailed responses in support of a Splash Pad
- Attention received in the local press includes a feature by Spotted in Ely, coverage in local parish magazines and a live interview on BBC Radio Cambridgeshire.
