The Prevention of Public Nuisance

Overview

Broad Street is primarily a residential street including several homes with young children. The vast majority of properties have windows and doors that directly adjoin the pavement.

We have experienced anti-social and drunken behaviour along the street as members of the public return from, or travel to, the train station late at night. This behaviour has included banging on property windows, walking on the bonnets and roofs of parked cars, standing and talking in front of properties (especially in doorways of older properties that used to be shops), and raised voices.

Fortunately, this behaviour is infrequent enough to be tolerable.

My general concern is that late night opening to the public beyond 23:30 will increase the amount of people, traffic, noise and anti-social behaviour on Broad Street after midnight as people arrive at and depart from the restaurant.

In addition, late night opening beyond 23:30 could mean the restaurant becomes a destination for people after most of the pubs in the area close at 23:00.

Evidence of the accumulation of members of the public late at night to order hot food can be seen at the Balti King on Market Street. However, Balti King is located in a primarily commercial area of the city.

I have fewer concerns with the premises being used for a late-night delivery service if the following condition suggested by Environmental Health is accepted: "The licence holder shall ensure no vehicles used for the delivery of their food shall attend the premises, or park on Broad Street, Jubilee Terrace, Missin Gate, and Ship Lane after 23:00"

Specific Concerns in Relation to the Premises Opening to the Public After 23:30

Late Night Destination – opening to the public beyond 23:30 will increase the amount of people entering and leaving the restaurant late at night and have the potential for the premises to become a late-night destination after pubs in the area have closed.

Smokers – patrons are likely to accumulate and talk on the street at the front of the restaurant. Patrons who have consumed alcohol have a tendency to converse in raised voices.

Car Parking – parking is likely to be in parking bays on Broad Street in front of residential housing, surrounding residential streets and Ship Lane car park. Patrons departing late at night will increase the amount of car doors closing and engines starting after midnight.

Traffic - the amount of traffic along Broad Street after midnight is likely to increase, including taxi pickups from outside the restaurant and delivery vehicles for the takeaway service. Page 2 of 3

CCTV – the CCTV system at the restaurant will only monitor the area near the premises. It will not provide any coverage of incidents that occur on the way to Ship Lane car park or in the other direction. As such it is unlikely to deter anti-social behaviour away from the immediate vicinity of the premises.

To whom it may concern,

Sorry, I have spent over an hour trying to access some sort of form to make representations of my concerns against the granting of some of the requests on the above license. This has been impossible from your website. Please could you record my comments or send me the link to this form. I understand the representations had to be in by midnight tonight.

These premises are surrounded by a lot of residential properties. I am concerned about the amount of noise and potential unsociable behaviour that would occur as a result of these late night openings. I am at number 23 Broad Street and when we moved here in 1989 there were a number of problems with smashed windows and fights when the previous restaurant on this site opened late and had an alcohol license. People leaving the riverside pubs would go there for more alcohol and cause a lot of disruption. The premises are quite small with hardly any outside space. The request for live music, dancing and other outside events are not practical here. The two large bins now permanently blocking part of the pavement are going to be unattractive and smelly.

None of the other restaurants in Broad Street have alcohol licenses or such late openings so they have not been of concern to residents.

After reading the Licensing Act 2003 notice on the frontage of Inferno BBQ in Ely (CB7 4BE), I note that they did on 5th August 2020 apply to ECDC for the grant of a premises license, under very concerning terms, i.e.

The provision of films, live music, performance and entertainment between the hours of 10:00 and 00:00 and 10:00 and 00:30

&
Recorded music between the hours of 06:30 and 00:00 and 06:30 and 01:00

&
Provision of late night refreshment between the hours of 23:00 and 00:30 and 23:00 and 01:30

&
Sale by retail of Alcohol between the hours of 10:00 and 00:00 and 10:00 and 01:00

Inferno BBQ is located in the middle of Broad Street; being a highly residential location, and opposite the beautiful Jubilee Gardens and backing on to Cherry Hill park and children's playground. The hours applied for of live music, recorded music, late night refreshment and sale of alcohol are deeply concerning to me as a local resident with young children. I firmly object to licensing hours beyond before 11:00am and after 11:00pm, as it is inevitable that it will result in loud noise and disturbance, and unsightly litter on Jubilee Gardens and Cherry Hill park (as proven post-lockdown by the clientele of RBK in the Maltings). I would ask that the licensing powers refuse the application of these excessive licensing hours. It would create a great deal of noise disturbance to local residents, and no double antisocial behaviour due to the proposed lengthy alcohol licensing hours applied for by Inferno BBQ.
