36	Red Lion	42, High Street, Swaffham Prior, CB25 0LD	Swaffham Prior Parish Council	The Red Lion is the only public house open in the village and as such, acts as a social and cultural centre to the village and its inhabitants; in the times of COVID19 it has provided an essential service to many elderly residents in stocking foodstuffs and selling at cost which has been valued by the parish council and local residents. The pub (pre-Covid-19) has been used by the community for a range of activities including a crib team and women's darts team. The pub is being used by the Community Heating Scheme as an information centre, for example in October 2020 they showcased a heat exchange unit in there. The venue has been used to showcase presentations and conduct consultations, including during Covid-19. All meetings of the Swaffham Prior Sports and Social Committee are held at the pub. There is no other community space in the village, as the Village Hall is currently closed due to Covid-19. More emphasis is being put on the pub because that is the only open commercial site in the village (there is no post office and no shops). The pub is always open as a meeting place in the afternoons (subject to Covid-19 restrictions) for anyone, and several groups have used it.
