REPRESENTATIONS FORM

PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

- . Shoplifting gangs create crime and disorder and this will increase further along the High street. Disorder is created when staff are confronted
- . Anti social behaviour will increase all over the High street instead of staying in the contained village centre triangle where it is more easily managed

PUBLIC SAFETY

. Customers on many occasions have tackled shoplifters and this has led to altercations . Arctic lorries will endanger all public. Co op deliveries are on 'small lorries and before 8am delivery basis'

PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUSIANCE

- . Noise, light pollution and litter will all be spread to the quietest and most idyllic part of the village from 5am until 11pm approx. everyday. Currently the triangle is the only pollution area with restaurants, takeaways and shops
- . The busiest roads in the village are Bell road and Lode road New shop will increase the traffic to the very quietest area of the High street

PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AND HARM

- The Co op shuts the post office for 30 mins in the afternoon everyday for children control and prevention of crime. The school provides a teacher most mornings at the shop for children control and extra staff provide cover at lunchtimes to prevent shoplifting by children. There are almost daily incidents of shoplifting including alcohol. This has led to incidents of children coming home drunk with stolen alcohol. Some children as young as 12 years old have stolen alcohol. At present all this is contained in the triangle
- . Bell road is the busiest road in the village and children will be crossing this to get to the new shop. It will mean spread of children all along the High street instead of containment in the controlled triangle area and in the school vicinity. This will lead to increase in nuisance, litter and potential harm to children for being further away from school
- . In the summer months there is always congregation of schoolchildren causing graffiti and small crimes and this will be spread across the village and harder to control $\,$
