

Additional Medical Evidence Requirements for Group 2 DVLA Medical Examination

IMPORTANT - PLEASE READ BEFORE YOUR APPOINTMENT

All applicants must provide a printout of their summary of medical records obtained from their registered GP surgery, dated within the last 31 days.

However, if you have any of the medical conditions listed below, you must also take additional supporting evidence, or your medical may be delayed or held pending further information. This additional information must also be submitted to the Licensing Authority.

Neurological conditions (e.g.	Consultant letter confirming diagnosis, current

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Hyper-tension	Three official blood pressure readings taken at least one day apart

Other Conditions (Bring GP Summary and be ready to discuss):

- High blood pressure
- Asthma or COPD
- Joint replacements or mobility issues
- Cancer history
- Mental health issues not listed above
- Recent surgery (within 6 months)
- Raised cholesterol

Photo ID (Driving License or Passport)
Glasses/contact lenses (if worn)
GP Summary of Medical Records (must be up to date)
Additional evidence if you have any of the conditions listed
A copy of East Cambridge District Council's current Medical Certificate (downloadable at www.eastcambs.gov.uk)
A copy of the current D4 medical report form pre-completed with your personal details in the relevant sections.

Special Notes - Please read:

Certain conditions exclude a person from meeting the Group 2 medical standards, e.g. applicants with monocular vision who do not hold grandfather rights will not meet Group 2 medical standards.
