

Further to your information request FOI/EIR 25/26-340, please find your question and our response below.

Request:

For the whole of the south and east Cambridgeshire taxi- and private-hire licensing district, including all city, suburban, and rural areas/villages covered by your authority, please provide the following for the last three calendar years (2022, 2023, 2024) and, if readily available, year-to-date 2025:

- 1) Complaints counts by category (and total):
- a) Refusal or failure to transport wheelchair users
- b) Refusal or failure to transport assistance-dog users
- c) Failure to provide reasonable assistance (e.g., loading/unloading wheelchairs, securing equipment)
- d) Alleged overcharging of disabled passengers
- e) Long wait / no accessible vehicle available (including rural locations)
- f) Other disability-related complaints (please list categories if used)

For each category above, please also state how many were:

- · Upheld or resulted in enforcement action; and
- Not upheld / no action taken.
- 2) Licensing context:
- a) The number of Wheelchair Accessible Vehicles (WAVs) currently licensed (hackney + private hire), by year
- b) The total number of active licensed taxi/private-hire drivers, by year
- c) If possible, a split between city and rural drivers/vehicles, or please confirm if not recorded.
- 3) Training & enforcement policy:
- a) Whether disability-awareness / assistance training is mandatory for licensed drivers, and details of the current policy/training specification if so.
- b) Any enforcement or penalty policy applied when drivers refuse wheelchair users or assistance-dog passengers.

- c) Not recorded, we do not have zones.

- a) Disability awareness training is mandatory for all hackney carriage and standard private hire drivers. They all watch a disability awareness video and answer a knowledge test including questions on disability awareness.
- b) We have a standard enforcement policy to deal with all enforcement issues, but we take an extremely tough stance on any refusals to carry assistance dogs, wheelchairs and where a driver fails to provide reasonable assistance
