

Decides the area to be covered (typically 20 - 50 houses) and completes a registration form. Discusses the introduction of neighbourhood watch with the local residents and obtains their contact details.

Window stickers will be provided to the coordinator to distribute to the residents wishing to join the scheme.

Obtains signs to fix in prominent locations (not compulsory). The signs are usually a free issue but please check. They will be fixed for you.

Identifies vulnerable people within the Scheme.









NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH WHAT DOES A COORDINATOR DO?

> Receives information from the local police (this usually comes by e-mail) *and passes relevant information to the neighbours.

Keeps in touch with the neighbours and welcomes new residents into the neighbourhood

Reports suspicious incidents to the police or other officials.

Generally, fosters a community spirit within the Scheme and encourages the neighbours to keep their homes secure and to look out for each other.
